National/ International Seminars/ Conferences/ Workshops

Department of Political Science with Rural Administration organized a UGC sponsored national seminar during 11-12 March 2015. The department had also organized a special lecture by the eminent scholar Professor Ranabir Sammaddar on 3 Feb 2016. Department of Business Administration had organized a UGC sponsored National Seminar on "Changing Dimensions of Business in the New Millennium" in March 2015 and an International Seminar on "Dynamic Evolution of Management



Paradigm" in February 2016. The Department of Commerce with Farm Management had organized a 14-day workshop on Research Methodology from 16 31 July 2015 in which 30 participants from different parts of the country participated. The Department had also organized a two-day UGC and ICSSR sponsored International Conference on 4-5 February 2016. The Bengali Department had organized a Workshop on Bangla Wikipedia on 25 Feb 2015. The Department of English had organized a UGC sponsored National Conference on "Marginality and Shakespeare" on 17 March 2015. The Department of Economics with Rural Development had organized a National Conference on "Contemporary Issues of Economic Development with Special Reference to Public Finance and Policy" on 17-18 Feb 2015. The conference was funded by the UGC and CTRFP, CSSC, Kolkata. The Department of Library and Information Science had organized a National Seminar on "National Mission on Libraries: Disseminating Knowledge for the Developing Societies" on 12-13 March 2015. The seminar was sponsored by the UGC and the Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation. The Department of Philosophy and the Life World had organized a UGC sponsored two-day National Conference on "Philosophical Perspectives of Tribal Religion" on 25-26 March 2015.

Centre for Women's Studies

The Centre is now housed in a new building and equipped with all modern facilities. As an interdisciplinary centre it is run by faculty members across different departments and is headed by a faculty member of the rank of Professor who continues to organize and spearhead the centre's activities as part of her additional charges. During 5-25 January 2016 the Centre successfully conducted a Winter School with 29 participants of different disciplines from different parts of the country. The programme is considered equivalent to a UGC sponsored Refresher Course. On 17 December 2015, the Centre organized an NHRC sponsored training programme for the benefit of the university students. The Centre's activities also include seminars and special lecture programmes on a regular basis, significant among which were talks delivered by Shamita Sarkar of the Department of History of this university on 31 July 2015 and by Miss Sagnika Chanda of the

University of Pittsburg, USA on 13 August 2015. Among the different programmes the Centre envisages to organize soon is an interdisciplinary M Phil Course in Women's Studies.

National Service Scheme

A faculty member of the Department of Philosophy is the Programme Coordinator of NSS. The university now boasts of a contingent of 13900 volunteers in this scheme. One of the most important services that they render is fighting environmental hazards and keeping the campus green. Three male and four female volunteers participated in the State Governor's Republic Day Parade at the Red Road. The Programme Officer accompanied two male and one female volunteers to the 20th National Youth Festival at Raipur during 12-16 January 2016. Dr Uttam Biswas, the Programme Officer joined five male and five female volunteers to the NI camp held at Ahmedabad in Gujarat. A Sensitization Programme was organized in the varsity campus in collaboration with MANT on 17 Feb 2016. Fifteen volunteers accompanied by one Programme Officer participated in Vivek Samhati Utsab, 2016 at Ramakrishna Mission, Golpark on 4.2.2016. NSS volunteers regularly organize Blood Donation and Thallasaemia Detection camps in the varsity and its adjoining areas. This apart the NSS team organizes Health Awareness programmes, Legal Awareness camp, Women's Self-Defence Training programme and seminars on societal and environmental development at regular intervals.



Sports and Physical Activities

The university cricket team beat Calcutta University in the finals to become the champion of Inter University 20-20 Cricket Tournament that took place in Viswa Bharati from 26 Feb to 1 March 2016. The university women's team clinched the 10th position in the Inter-University Yoga Competition held at Chowdhury Ranbir Sing University. The university students participated in the Inter University Football Tournament in October 2015 at Kashi Vidyapith in Varanasi. From the Convenor, Newsletter Committee

It is a pleasure to announce that the third issue of the varsity Newsletter is now ready for circulation. We apologize for not being able to bring out any issue in the year 2015. This issue

therefore attempts to fill the gap by including events and accomplishments of the university for a slightly extended period of time, namely from Nov 2014 through March 2016. The quantum and quality of academic and infrastructural progress during the period although substantial should not in any way cause complacency to us. The intention of this folio



publication is only to provide a brief resume of the university's primary achievements for little less than one and half years.

Two major infrastructural developments during the period have been the opening of the state-of-the-art, two-tier, wainscoted and fully air-conditioned auditorium, christened Vivekananda Sabhagriha, having a capacity of holding a thousand strong audience and boasting of a dolby digital sound system; and the inauguration of a brightly lit, capacious and ergonomically developed building as annexe to the administrative block. The eco-friendly auditorium complex cradles three other high-fidelity seminar halls equipped with all necessary gadgets. This is a muchneeded supplement to the existing fleet of four conference venues so much so that on several occasions all the seven venues remain simultaneously abuzz with activities.

This university has the rare distinction of being one of the only three varsities of West Bengal to receive RUSA grant of Rs 20 Crores (first instalment) from the State Government. The allocation is being used to build up several infrastructural facilities, of which noteworthy are a one off modern garbage disposal system on campus and an ICT system in the varsity library. The university canteen Dulung has now shifted to its own two-tier building and started offering for the first time in West

Bengal subsidized meals to the postgraduate students. The only institutional setup for academic research on tribal culture and literature within the varsity system of this state is now located in our campus as an interdisciplinary *Centre for Adivasi Studies*. It maintains an *Adivasi Museum* as part of its archival project. Conferral of the award of D Lit and D Sc on a regular mode has started. Six departments of the faculty of Arts and Commerce have introduced M Phil programmes on a regular basis. In the last



academic year this university has signed a couple of Memorandums of Understanding, one each with the University of Lodz, Poland and the University of Chittagong, Bangladesh. Professor Kaushik Sankar Bose of the Department of Anthropology has been awarded a Collaborative Exchange Programme hosted by the Indian National Science Academy and the Polish Academy of Sciences. Professor Bidhan Chandra Patra, Dean Faculty of Science has received the D Sc degree from Utkal University and Professor Joydev Sasmal of the Department of Economics with Rural Development has been awarded the Anamitra Saha Prize of the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics for the best paper published in Indian Journal of



Agricultural Economics. Professor Prakash Chandra Dhara of the Department of Human Physiology with Community Health has obtained a design registration from the Patent Office, Government of India, on Brick Dice.
