

#### Vision and functioning of USIC:

University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC) started its journey in the year 1993; its aim is to uplift the quality of research in basic as well as applied field of science carried out by the faculty members of this University. Since 2010, centre is functioning the newly built Einstein building. The University authority with the able leadership of our present Vice-Chancellor has taken initiative to enhance the infrastructure of the centre. Recently, two big halls have been allotted for USIC. During XIth plan period UGC sanctioned two technical manpower and nearly Rs.130 L for procuring sophisticated instrument and soft ware for the centre. Instruments were purchased keeping in mind the need of the research fraternity of the University. So far the centre has 15 different instruments for helping cutting edge research in different field of Physical, Chemical and biological sciences. All the faculty members are highly benefitted from the service provided by the centre.

USIC provides the service of following instruments:

## **National Service Scheme (NSS)**

#### Introduction:

National Service Scheme (NSS) was introduced at this university in 1987 as a part of the extension programmes and since then NSS has been functioning as a regular feature in the realm of our university education to help the students to get the sense of social responsibilities with the help of the principal motto of NSS 'NOT ME BUT YOU'. The volunteers will get the scope to develop their personalities through community service. The overall objective of the scheme is educational and service to the community is the activity through which the objective is sought to be achieved. It is a student–centred programme in which projects are implemented by the NSS volunteers in the community in close collaboration with the clientele community and thereby it provides vast scope for the students' interaction with the people. While interacting with the community the students learn many things which they cannot learn from theory classes. Thus the scheme is aimed at developing the human soul in such a way that the student is mentally shaped to fit into the society he belongs to and will continue to live in.

#### **NSS Office:**

In the university there is a well equipped NSS Office with one part-time Programme Coordinator and two full-time Office Assistants (on contract).

#### **Organisation :**

NSS programmes are implemented in the colleges affiliated to the university and Post-Graduate departments of the university. To supervise and coordinate the functioning of the scheme, there is a part-time Coordinator. Since NSS is an educational programme in all respects, the provision of appointment of a senior faculty as the Coordinator is mandatory as per the Government norms. The 'NSS Cell' under the leadership of the Coordinator takes care of the day to day functioning of the scheme. All records, books of accounts etc. are maintained by the Cell, Planning, programming, monitoring, supervision and evaluation of activities are undertaken on a regular basis by the Cell as per NSS Manual and Guidelines issued by the Government of India and the State Government from time to time. The overall planning and supervision are being done by the University Level Advisory Committee chaired by the Vice-Chancellor. The Committee includes academics, administrators, government officials and some Principals of the affiliated colleges.

Field activities are actually undertaken at the college and by the postgraduate students at the University. Each unit consisting of 100 student volunteers is placed under a Programme Officer appointed by the college and trained by the NSS Training Centre. The Programme Officer is a whole-time teacher and acts as a planner, administrator, motivator, and supervisor and above all, as a philosopher at the base level. All activities at the colleges are supervised by the College Level Advisory Committee headed by the Principal.

Annual Meets of the Programme Officers, Principals regularly devise plans and programmes for the year and such meetings are attended by the representatives of the NSS Regional Centre and the Coordinator, Training and Orientation, as well as the Vice-chancellor and Programme Coordinator. The NSS Cell of university Collaboration Program organizes collaborative programme for the benefit of the volunteers as well as for the society. Following collaborating programmes were organized: (i) Thalasaemia Detection and Awareness Camp with Midnapore Thalasaemia Society; (ii) Environmental Awareness Programme with Garia Institute of Environmental Management; (iii) Seminar on Drug Abusement with Midnapore Social Welfare Forum and Khagarpur FERA; (iv) AIDS Day Celebration with Paschim Banga Vigyan Mancha, Midnapore; (v) Seminar on 'The Role of University in Societal Development' with Alumni Association of Vidyasagar University; (vi) Skill Development Programme with TCS, Kolkata; (vii) Orientation Training Programme with TORC, Narendrapur.

#### **Programmes Conducted:**

- **Blood Donation**: NSS Cell of Vidyasagar University takes initiation regularly to motivate the volunteers to donate in need blood for the sake of the society. Last five years 52 blood donation camps were held and near about 4000 volunteers participated.
- **Plantation Programme**: Every year plantation programmes are conducted by the NSS cell to enrich the volunteers regarding the environment .In University and colleges near about 15000 trees were planted.
- **Pulse Polio Immunization Programme**: This programme is conducted with great importance to make our nation Polio-free and healthy.
- Asset Creation: NSS Cell created assets in various adopted villages and campus through plantation, development of morality sense among the volunteers and the villagers etc. Preparing Kachha Road in villages for the benefit of the locality.
- **Primary Health Awareness Programme**: Every year Health Awareness programme are conducted to enhance the concept of Healthy India and Healthy Youth among the volunteers. Last five years 100 health awareness programmes were conducted under the guidance of NSS Cell in various colleges and university.
- **Thalassaemia Detection Camp**: To minimize the possibility of thalassaemia in our locality, the NSS Cell arrenges awareness programs among students, villagers, slum dwellers about arenging medical tests for this disease and detecting thalassaemia career. In Last five years, 1500 volunteers got the opportunity to participate in the detection camp.
- **Programmes on Drug Abuse**: NSS Cell of this university takes initiative regularly through various programmes to spread awareness of the evils of drug abuse. Five such programme were held in this regard
- World Aids Day Celebration: NSS Cell takes initiative through procession, discussion, street drama, posters and seminar to sensitize the volunteers as well as the local people regarding the Aids and other sexual transmitted diseases.
- **Outreach Programme**: NSS volunteers are sent to various Adventure Camps to nourish their sense of culture, values and other experiences and to enrich themselves. Every year near about 40 students are sent to attend such programmes.

• **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Avijan and National Youth Policy 2014**: This programme is newly launched and conducted by the NSS Cell of this university with a Lecture Session and a procession to highlight this program was taken out on 21.02.2014.
